This is Dave Koehler from Faith United PC and on behalf of the Presbytery I would like to ask if any one from First Presbyterian might have an interest in being a part of a Presbytery Mission Committee? I know that First Pres has been actively engaged in the mission of the church over the years.

At this point the details are not well defined. This group would work with the new Executive Presbyter for Mission to develop our mission focus as a Presbytery, and coordinate mission activities throughout the Presbytery, helping congregations partner with one another for shared mission projects, create new mission opportunities, and educate the Presbytery as a whole on what "mission" really is all about. Since we have not had a Presbytery Mission Committee for a number of years, this group, working with the EP for Mission, would be free, at least in part, to put together their own understandings of how the Presbytery approaches mission, locally, nationally, and globally. They would not necessarily be the ones to do all the work, but they would put together ideas and share them with the congregations, and they would help congregations who are doing certain mission work toward other congregations who might also be doing this, so they might do it together. They may also look into a Presbytery-sponsored Mission Trip to a place in the country or region that has been hit by a disaster or has a great need for help. # A Message from you Stewardship Committee

Stewardship Campaign Report

The Stewardship Campaign for 2021 resulted in total pledges of \$298,269.24. We had a total of 63 pledges.

As you can see, a review of the pledging totals show they have decreased yearly since 2017. The biggest drop was between 2018 and 2019 when pledges were \$60,000 less. Last year they increased slightly to \$323,000. Resuming the decrease this year, there has been a \$25,000 less pledged.

Of the 63 pledges, a total of 21 pledges increased, 20 pledges stayed the same, 9 pledges decreased and there are 5 new pledges. So far there are 15 pledges from last year that have not renewed.

The pledge ranges demonstrate how the pledges vary. It should be noted that the top four pledges accounted for \$116,000 of our total. If you include those donations of \$15,000 and higher it accounts for \$161,000 of the total. Thus, more than half (54%) is given by the top 7 givers. This underscores how dependent we are on a few people in the congregation and how the loss of one of them would affect the total.

On behalf of the Stewardship Committee and the church we would like to thank everyone who pledged for next year. Your pledges are what gives First Presbyterian Church to do all that it does. Please see the next page for the breakdown.

# Lent begins February 17th; are you considering "giving something up" as part of your Lenten obligation? Here is a list of 18 items that are something everyone could consider. They are even great to do forever!

### Here are 18 things you might consider giving up this Lent and beyond:

- 1. Fear: God is on my side. In Him I am more than a conqueror. (See Romans 98)
- 2. The need to please everyone: I can't please everyone anyway. There is only one I need to strive to please.
- 3. Envy: I am blessed. My value is not found in my possessions, but in my relationship with my Heavenly Father.
- 4. Impatience: God's timing is the perfect timing.
- 5. Sense of entitlement: The world does not owe me anything. God does not owe me anything. I live in humility and grace.
- 6. Bitterness and Resentment: The only person I am hurting by holding onto these is myself.
- 7. Blame: I am not going to pass the buck. I will take responsibility for my actions.
- 8. Gossip and Negativity: I will put the best construction on everything when it comes to other people. I will also minimize my contact with people who are negative and toxic and bring other people down.
- 9. Comparison: I have my own unique contribution to make and there is no one else like me.
- 10. Fear of failure: You don't succeed without experiencing failure. Just make sure you fall forward.
- 11. A spirit of poverty: Believe with God that there is always more than enough and never a lack.
- 12. Feelings of unworthiness: You are fearfully and wonderfully made by your creator. (see Psalm 139)
- 13. Doubt: Believe God has a plan for you that is beyond anything you could imagine. The future is brighter than you could ever realize.
- 14. Self-pity: God comforts us in our sorrow so that we can comfort others with the comfort we ourselves have received from God.
- 15. Excuses: A wise man once said, if you need an excuse, any excuse will do.

# Per Capita - A brief history

The earliest mention of something like a per capita apportionment dates back to the 1700s.

In the mid-1800s, a "plan of mileage" was adopted by the General Assembly to defray the expenses of commissioners attending General Assembly meetings so that everyone could be present to participate regardless of distance or financial resources. Over time, per capita has been used to fund "ecclesiastical and administrative" functions that are shared by the whole church. In 1995, the following definition was developed.

Per capita is an opportunity for all communicant members of the Presbyterian church through the governing bodies to participate equally, responsibly, and interdependently by sharing the cost of coordination and evaluation of mission; and of performing ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions that identify a Reformed Church, while at the same time strengthening the sense of community among all Presbyterians (GA Minutes, Part I, 1995).

Per capita for the year 2021 is \$42.48 per member.


