I will utter dark sayings from of old, things that we have heard and known, that our ancestors have told us. We will not hide them from their children; we will tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and His might, and the wonders that He has done.

from Psalm 78:2-4

Friends,

Over the next few weeks, as we do every year, we will gather and retell a very, very old story. We'll tell this story through scripture and song and drama and prayer. We'll tell it with feasts and gifts and trees and lights and cards and cookies. Through all this, we'll retell the story of the birth of Jesus Christ.

But how often do we really think about the elements of that story? Sure, we all know the plot (expectant couple travels, girl gives birth in a barn, gets unexpected visitors). We know the setting (a road trip from Nazareth to Bethlehem over 2000 years ago). We also know all the characters that we've seen in every Christmas pageant ever. A man and his bride-tobe. A baby. Some shepherds. Some wise men. A busy innkeeper and a ruthless king. A few angels. Santa Claus. Ebenezer Scrooge. Charlie Brown, Rudolph, Frosty, and the Grinch. (Oops, wrong stories!)

Future generations will be told about the Lord, and proclaim His deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying that He has done it.

from Psalm 22:30-31

But any good story needs a couple of other elements. It needs a conflict. Some drama between a dastardly villain and a noble hero. And the story needs a resolution. Some climax when good triumphs over evil. These are the parts of any story that may be harder to place. But these conflicts and resolutions are the reason stories keep getting told. A good storyteller builds up the tension of the conflict, ramping up real uncertainty that a happy ending can be possible. And then the storyteller celebrates the resolution with the audience, all breathing a sigh of relief as the characters we've come to love live happily ever after.

That's what makes the story of the Nativity worth telling over and over again every year. The conflict, rather than being just someone in a white hat against someone in a black hat, is nothing less than Good vs. Evil. God, the loving creator of the world, going up against the corruption of that world that separates all people from God. And the resolution? Good news of great joy! Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace and goodwill to all! And the world being reconciled with our Creator, so that God is truly with us.

And, like any great story, no matter how many times it's been told, we love to hear that happy ending.



For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope.


