'Have you entered the storehouses of the snow, or have you seen the storehouses of the hail, which I have reserved for the time of trouble...?'

From Job 38:22-23

Friends,

The book of Job contains some of the Bible's most majestic depictions of God as the creator and controller of the universe. According to Job, the Lord is the one who commands the sun to rise and the stars to turn in the heavens. It is God who brings lightning and thunder, sunshine and darkness, summer and yes, winter.

As I've moved further north from my birthplace in Texas, I've gained a lot more respect for this Biblical description of what winter can be like. I think about these words every time we have to consider cancelling a worship service or church event because of the cold or the wind, the ice or the snow. And even when most of us remain warm and safe in our homes, we may still pause to wonder, why? Why does God subject us to weather that chills us to the bone? Is this our moment to say a prayer of thanksgiving for our coat and our furnace? Is God trying to move us to check in on our neighbors or maybe even shovel their sidewalk? Is this our inspiration to support the Warming Shelter three blocks north of our own sanctuary? Does God mean to cause brief, unexpected Sabbaths that force us to take a day off from work, school, or even church? Or does God simply want to keep us humble by disrupting our lives with forces we could never control?

'From its chamber comes the whirlwind, and cold from the scattering winds. By the breath of God ice is given, and the broad waters are frozen fast.'

Job 37:9-10

But maybe our questioning is part of God's purpose in natural events like we experience almost every winter. Even when we're asking why God does this, or when God will STOP this, we are contemplating God. Maybe God brings about times like this so that we'll stop and remember the One who brings the snow and controls the wind. When we look to the Lord, searching for meaning, maybe that search is the meaning we're supposed to find.

Frances Wile's hymn "All Beautiful the March of Days" contains the evocative line, "The Hand that shaped the rose hath wrought the crystal of the snow." As we endure the rest of this winter, let us continue to turn our thoughts and our prayers to the Lord who brings the winter, and who will carry us through it. And may we also remember that it is the Lord who will inevitably bring the warmer temperatures and the new life of the spring.

'They turn round and round by His guidance, to accomplish all that He commands them on the face of the habitable world. Whether for correction, or for His land, or for love, He causes it to happen.'


