

Friends,

Imagine that you're walking on the sun-drenched shore of the Sea of Galilee. You look out over the water to see a boat full of people. Suddenly, you see the boat capsize and dump all its passengers into the sea! The people floundering around in the water shout out to you in Hebrew, "Hosanna! Hosanna!" What are they shouting at you?

We are used to hearing this word on Palm Sunday, at the end of the Lenten season. We encounter this scene as we remember the beginning of the last week of Jesus' earthly life, as he rides triumphantly into Jerusalem.

The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

And what did people cry out to him? "Hosanna!" In the original Hebrew, these people are shouting "Save us!"

Throughout the Bible, people have made this same, plaintive cry to the Lord God. They begged God to save them from very real, immediate threats like injury or disease, drought or famine, invading armies or betrayal by trusted friends. Jesus' own disciples had their own occasion to plead for him to save them.

A gale arose on the lake, so great that the boat was being swamped by the waves; but he was asleep. And they went and woke him up, saying, 'Lord, save us! We are perishing!'

But other times we need salvation from other, less tangible dangers. Often, these perils are so powerful and so constant that we could never rescue ourselves, no matter what we tried. We need God to save us from judgment and chaos. From ignorance and fear. God is also great and good enough to help us in those times.

But God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which He loved us even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—

Ephesians 2:4-5

Friends, we'll spend the season of Lent looking at some of the many situations in our lives when we cry out, "Hosanna, Lord! Save us!" As we do, we'll see how God has promised that, when we are faithful enough to take these times and put them in God's powerful, loving hands, God will look on us with mercy and will be our salvation. And as the Lenten season progresses toward Easter, we'll learn more about how, in Jesus Christ, God has even offered us all salvation from those two eternal, invincible forces over which we have no power: sin and death. In all of this, we believe that God listens and cares whenever we are faithful enough to cry out, "Hosanna, Lord! Save us!"

Surely God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid, for the LORD GOD is my strength and my might; He has become my salvation.

#### GOOD FRIDAY, APRIL 15<sup>TH</sup>


Our local Presbyterian churches will host a Good Friday "Tenebrae" service at 6:30 p.m. in our sanctuary.

In cooperation with the Pastor, Director of Music and committee members, its duties are the planning, maintaining, and supervision of music and worship within the Church. Music in worship is not an end unto itself. Music in worship is meant to invite the congregation to participate in ways that inspire and nurture. This happens when we listen to preludes played on an organ, anthems sung by a choir, offertories rung by handbells, or musical works played by instrumentalists of all varieties and configurations who offer their praise and worship on our behalf. Musicians (professional, avocational, amateur, and recreational) offer their gifts in ways that inspire and nurture a listening congregation. The committee also makes sure music libraries, equipment, robes, handbells and any equipment - is in working condition and maintenance is kept up. Palms for Palm Sunday, when communion is served, paraments and more - are all part of the committee too. Our committee helps worship with the sound system and online presence and more.
