Friends,

One of our confirmation classes explored the difficult question, "Why did Jesus have to die?" This is a question you may have asked every year as our church journeys through the season of Lent together. In our faith based on peace and love, why do we dedicate weeks in the spring to talking about why one man had to suffer and die for us?

Jesus compared himself to a seed. Any seed has to be buried in the earth, giving up its old self to create a new plant. Jesus knew that, like a seed, he had to die and be buried in order to be resurrected to new life. And in that new life, Jesus bore the fruit of redemption from sin and of eternal life for all who put their faith in him. In doing so, Jesus also lived as an example to encourage Christians to be willing to give up our old ways of living; to become so new in our faith that we seem to die and be born again into a new life.

Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead, so we too might walk in newness of life.

from Romans 6:4

But even as Christians, many of us don't like change. How many of us have been reluctant to start worship at a different time, or to sing an unfamiliar hymn during worship? How then can we accept a faith that calls us to die to our old life? Only by embracing the hope of how hope-filled, peace-filled and joy-filled that new life in Christ can be. We only choose to die to our old lives with the belief that the new life that God offers us in Christ will be unimaginably better. Farmers, after spending thousands of dollars on seeds, wouldn't dare bury all those seeds in the ground. Not without the promise that such a sacrifice will bear fruit; that each of those seeds will yield thirty, sixty, or a hundredfold.

Those who go out weeping, bearing the seed for sowing, shall come home with shouts of joy, carrying their sheaves.

Psalm 126:6

As we complete our journey through Lent, may we embrace this promise of the rebirth of Easter Sunday. As farmers look forward to their seeds bursting from the ground in new life, let us imagine how we may embrace the new, changed life that God offers us. And in that new life, may we all bear the fruit of love for God and for all of God's people.

You have been born anew, not of perishable but of imperishable seed, through the living and enduring word of God.





This month we are highlighting **Administration & Finance**.

The Finance and Administration Commission meets once a month (third Monday at 12:15pm) and has two primary responsibilities assigned to it - managing and reporting the overall financial health of the Church, and; overseeing the general office and administrative operation for the Church.

In terms of Point #1, our Commission works closely with Karen to review financial transactions occurring during the month (monies received and expenses paid) and tracks our bank balances to ensure we have enough money to pay our bills. We then report our financial condition to the Congregation via our monthly newsletter insert. We initiate the annual Financial Audit, normally performed by Church members who are professionally trained to complete such activities, in May to ensure we are following Generally Accepted Accounting Practices (GAAP) and that all transactions are appropriate and properly documented. In the Fall, we work with all the various Commissions and Committees to create our Annual Budget, which is then presented to the Congregation for approval at our Congregation Meeting in November. Finally, we work closely with the Endowment Committee to manage the restricted funds gifted to us over the years, ensure an appropriate return, and utilize the funds as needed to best support the mission of the Church.

As for Point #2, our Commission works closely with both Pastor and Karen to support the day-to-day operation of the Church and provide guidance as needed. We review our insurance coverages and other vendor relationships regularly and as needed. We approve purchases needed to support office activities, such as buying office equipment, furniture, and other larger purchases. We review office and administrative policies and procedures, updating and documenting policy changes as needed. We work closely with the Personnel Commission to support our Church employees as they perform the work required by the Church, and on-board new employees as they join our Church staff.

It goes without saying that the work of this Commission is much easier to complete when we have such a dedicated and professional Office Manager to work with in Karen Heinemann. We are very thankful and blessed that she effectively manages so many of the day-to-day administrative and financial tasks that do not require our constant attention. We are a small but mighty Commission made up of Pastor, Karen, and five members of the Congregation (Suzan Stewart, Gerald Messersmith, Chris Hunt, John Mayne, and myself). We welcome new members to join us who can bring their ideas and talent and have an interest in the behind-the-scenes work that we oversee. If you are interested in learning more, please contact me or the Office.
