Friends,

On June 12<sup>th</sup> our confirmation class students will be confirmed as members of our church. I've been blessed to be able to spend the last few months of Sundays with Nate Hynds and Suri Uhl, as well as Emma Nelson from Westminster Presbyterian Church. I've been fascinated to learn where our conversations about our faith lead them and how they relate our beliefs to their own young lives.

But like every pastor, I worry that these teens might consider their confirmation service to be their "graduation" from church; that they will finish the service, walk out of the church and never return. Yes, we expect them to begin making their own decisions about how they'll participate in our church. But I hope that when they are given this freedom and this responsibility, they'll choose to continue to worship and serve with all of us.

Give instruction to the wise, and they will become wiser still; teach the righteous and they will gain in learning.

Proverbs 9:9

One of the reasons that these young people shouldn't consider this their "graduation" is that they still have so much to learn. While I've asked them to process an enormous amount of scripture, theology, and conversations about their lives in the church, we've still only scratched the surface of what our faith can mean to them. I hope that these teens will look to our Adult Bible Study as an example. When I attend this Bible Study, I find myself sitting with people my age and older who are all still in the process of learning more about God's word and how they can live that word. We've all been confirmed. But we're not done learning.

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus ... so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

2 Timothy 3:14-15, 17

For these teens, confirmation class has been like kindergarten. They've learned the fundamentals. Now they're ready to learn by doing. As confirmed members of our church, they are eligible to serve as deacons and elders. They can vote in our congregational meetings. But most of all, they can keep on learning. They can take everything they've been learning from books and videos and exercises and their mission project over the last few months and put it into practice. They can continue to read the Bible and pray and worship and serve. For our confirmation class students, kindergarten is over. Now they can begin the rest of their lives of living and learning and growing in Christ.

But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen.



#### Message from Finance

#### **Dear Church family:**

I am writing this letter on behalf of the Finance Committee and Session to let you know more about our financial situation.

We have been running with a negative balance in our checking account since February with an increasing deficit occurring over the past four months. Some of the deficit is related to expenses not anticipated, such as \$15,052 for gas utilities in 2022 due to the natural gas surcharge passed along by Mid-American Energy. We had budgeted \$5,000 for the first four months.

We also have had some building maintenance expenses, such as wiring for the kitchen and back hallway, as well as other projects that the Buildings and Grounds Commission has had to complete to properly maintain our building and keep us safe.

We have also lost some key members in our congregation who were generously underwriting some of these projects in past years. Our giving year-to-date is \$18,000 less than budgeted, primarily attributed to lower non-pledged and loose offering gifts. The combination of higher expenses and lower gifting has amounted to a \$10,000 loss each month for the past three months. Although we have been able to move \$35,000 from our operating endowment fund, we cannot continue to rely on these funds to cover the shortfall for an extended period without exhausting this account.

Session has instructed each committee to review their budgets and spending, reducing their costs where they are able to without adversely affecting the church or our key programs. Buildings and Grounds have deferred many of the projects planned for the spring and summer to later in the year or 2023 to reduce their costs. We will be able to reduce our deficit to some degree by taking these actions but need your help to help increase the funds received each month. It is a difficult request to make in these challenging times, but I am asking on behalf of Session if each person attending would consider giving just a little bit more to help with our financial crisis.

If you have any questions or would like to discuss our financial situation in more detail, please feel free to reach out to any of the members of the Finance Committee or Session. Thank you in advance for your help as we all look for opportunities to keep our Church on firm financial footing.


