

#### August 1, 2022

Friends,

You may remember skits performed on the children's television show "Sesame Street". The skits would introduce people who kids might meet every day, like a grocer, a police officer, or a teacher. The skits would end with characters singing, "These Are the People in Your Neighborhood."

During worship over the next few weeks, we'll be talking about the people in Jesus' neighborhood. Most of these stories will come from the gospel of Luke. While Matthew is often about Jesus' sermons, Mark is about Jesus' miracles, and John is about the poetry of Jesus' life, the gospel of Luke is often more about the compassion and humanity that Jesus showed individuals.

Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through it. A man was there named Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax-collector and was rich. He was trying to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature.

from Luke 19:1-3

Many of these stories are there to show how Jesus dealt on a personal level with the people he met. Rather than always trying to preach to crowds of people or perform miracles in front of thousands, many times the best way Jesus could show the love of God was by showing that love to one person. These people, and the witnesses around them, could then spread the stories of what Jesus had done. Jesus took these opportunities to teach people, to heal them, and to offer for-giveness to them.

... Jesus entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying.



Yes, a few people may have opportunities to affect multitudes by building churches, raising millions of dollars, or bringing thousands of new believers to Christ. But for many of us, the greatest impact we'll have for the Kingdom of God will be in these personal, intimate settings with just a handful of people, or only one. By living according to Jesus' example, we can use our own opportunities to bring God's hope, joy and peace to the people next to us. While Jesus showed God's love for the world, we can spend our lives showing God's love to one person at a time, in our own neighborhood.

Then Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.'

When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

#### Director of Christian Discipleship First Presbyterian Church Sioux City, Iowa Job Description

Title: Director of Christian Discipleship

**Purpose:** Serve the Christian Discipleship ministry with comprehensive oversight of programs and volunteers dedicated to the ongoing Christian formation of children, youth, their parents, and other adults within the congregation contributing to the overall mission of First Presbyterian Church, Sioux City.

Reports to: Pastor, Christian Discipleship Committee

#### Responsibilities:

Identify and coordinate curriculum choices for Sunday school, Vacation Bible School, Adult Bible Study and Confirmation in conversation with the Christian Discipleship Committee.

Recruit and train teachers/volunteers for Sunday school and VBS. When a Sunday school teacher or volunteer is unavailable on any Sunday, the Director should be prepared to take their place that day.

Develop and lead training for the participation of children and younger youth in worship as acolytes and bible carriers.

Work with our Children's Choir director to feature children's musical talents in worship.

Work with outside Christian educators to plan, promote and participate in multi-church events.

Promote upcoming Christian Discipleship activities well in advance via bulletins, newsletters, texts, emails, and/or social media.

Recognize and thank leaders and participants in Christian Discipleship activities.

Work with the Christian Discipleship committee to arrange an annual budget.

Lead annual performance reviews for Creche attendants.

Will keep sufficient supplies available for teachers.

Will provide direct supervision, planning, and implementing of:

Sunday Church School

• Children's music activities

• Supervision and staffing of the Crèche for all services and meetings

Other duties as necessary.

#### Minimum Qualifications:

Experience teaching and/or leading Christian Education/Discipleship programs. Background check is a requirement of employment.

#### **Physical Requirements:**

Able to move freely in and out of different congregational settings (homes, church, businesses).

Able to speak in a public setting

#### Work Hours:

Part Time position including required hours every Sunday morning 9:00 - 11:30 during school year. Ensure Sunday School goes smoothly, be available to all the teachers, and supervise the crèche. Required attendance of monthly staff meetings and Christian Discipleship committee meetings. Office Hours as necessary.

## **Endowment Fund**

#### Market Update

Uncomfortably high inflation and geopolitical unrest were the major sources of market volatility during the first half of 2022. Most major equity markets entered bear market territory (down 20%) during the second quarter. Even bonds, which normally provide a safe haven, fell as a result of rising interest rates. Through the end of June, the First Presbyterian Church Agency declined 15.2%. Since inception of management in early 2012, the portfolio assets have produced a rate of return of 5.0% annually after management fees. The overall mix of the endowment portfolio remains in-line with the target allocation of 65% equities and 35% fixed income and cash.

As we look ahead, markets could remain volatile as uncertainty shapes the economic outlook. Consumers are battling high inflation, however supply shortages seem to be easing. Despite the ongoing inflationary environment, the labor market continues to be a bright spot. Recent jobs reports beat market estimates while jobless claims remain near historic lows. The Fed will likely remain aggressive in the near term in their efforts to reduce inflation. As we move into the third quarter, we are comfortable with how the portfolio is positioned. The account will remain well diversified with a tilt towards value (stocks) and shorter term bond maturities (bonds). Both strategies have worked well in this challenging environment.

## **Estate Planning Tip**

Tax Legislation That May Benefit You

An added feature of our Estate Planning Tip is that we want to keep you informed of pending and passed tax legislation that may benefit you. On March 1, 2022, Iowa Governor Kim Reynolds signed into law what has commonly been referred to as a flat tax for Iowa. The most significant feature of this law is that it will reduce the top current personal income tax rate of 8.53% to 3.9% in 2026. Although the bill impacts

personal income tax rates, many other parts of the bill may generate tax savings, too. Other features of the new bill include:

• Exemption of "retirement income" for those age 55 or older, including the recipient or their spouse's Individual

Retirement Accounts (IRAs), pension plans or annuities.

• 100% exclusion from state capital gains for any sale of "qualified" stock by a stock owner who acquired the stock while employed with the company. This exclusion will be phased in, with a complete exclusion as of 2025. Talk with your CPA and lawyer as there are conditions that must be met.

• Some farm lease and real estate income for a farmer 55 years or age or older, who no longer materially participates in a farm tenancy, may be excluded from their state income tax for land that the farmer owned for 10 or more years. In addition, the bill allows a retired famer 55 or older to exclude capital gains from their state income tax for the sale of farm real estate if they materially participated. This new exclusion becomes effective for the 2023 state tax year.

Many of these new policies provide important opportunities to plan for the future with some new tools. Be sure to visit with your professional advisors when updating or reviewing your estate plan.

The information above is broad in nature and we recommend visiting with your professional advisor, attorney or CPA if you have a charitable intent or want to learn more about ways to extend IRA payouts to children named as IRA beneficiaries.
