The apostle Paul said something strange to members of the church in Corinth –

For we are the aroma of Christ to God among those who are being saved ... a fragrance from life to life.

From 2 Corinthians 2:15-16

How can Christians be a fragrance? Sure, we all may have known someone who had their own peculiar smell, either from lack of bathing or from too much cologne. I once knew an Italian chef who seemed to walk around in his own cloud of garlic vapors! But how can a Christian be the aroma of Christ?

First we have to realize that all of our five senses, including our sense of smell, are important to God (we'll be talking more about this during worship through the season of Advent). When God was giving Moses instructions for the creation of the tabernacle (a portable temple for the Hebrews as they traveled through the wilderness), God gave specific instructions about what aromas people would smell there -

The LORD spoke to Moses: Take the finest spices: of liquid myrrh ... of sweet-smelling cinnamon ... of aromatic cane, and of cassia ... and a hin of olive oil; and you shall make of these a sacred anointing-oil blended as by the perfumer; it shall be a holy anointing-oil ... Take sweet spices, stacte, and onycha, and galbanum, sweet spices with pure frankincense ... and make an incense blended as by the perfumer, seasoned with salt, pure and holy;

From Exodus 30:22-25, 34-35

To God, these particular fragrances, that people would ONLY smell in the tabernacle, would make it a special, sacred place; set aside for worship. Churches continued this tradition through the use of incense in their worship spaces, making the smells of smoke, spices and perfume a part of people's relationship with God. People would come to associate these scents with the presence of the Lord.

So what special smell should we have as Christians? Maybe it's not how we smell, but just the sensation of being around us that Paul is comparing to fragrance. I used to live near a bakery which had vents blowing the hot air from their kitchen out onto the sidewalk, so that anyone walking by smelled fresh baked bread, cookies and pastries. To people passing by, that aroma was proof of what they could receive inside. In the same way, Paul says that we can be "the aroma of Christ". By living according to Christ's word and Christ's example, we can be that evidence to everyone we meet of what faith in Christ can offer them. We can make God's love something they can experience for themselves; something tangible that will make them want more. Even though we may not smell like Jesus, as Christians we can still give the people around us the experience of knowing Christ.

But thanks be to God, who ... through us spreads in every place the fragrance that comes from knowing him.
